## Tenjin Pleasant Town to Walk Around

Tenjin, the biggest commercial town in western Japan, accommodates many commercial facilities and office buildings. The town enables you to enjoy shopping and gourmet food with a great array of facilities from large commercial complex and underground shopping malls to off-street unique shops, small cafes, food stalls and restaurants. It is a very convenient place for shopping with most shops opening until 8pm and there are also 24-hour convenience stores and supermarkets. Many restaurants offer dishes at reasonable prices and open till midnight. In addition to the local dishes of fresh seafood, motsunabe (beef or pork offal hotpot), mizutaki (chicken broth hotpot) and Ramen, you can also enjoy Asian-style cuisine and various other cuisines around here. Tenjin is a compact package of everything, with these shops and restaurants all within walking distance.

### Ramen and Yatai (food stall)

Tenjin is the best place to eat Tonkotsu (pork bone) Ramen. There are plenty of noodle shops offering thin noodles served in a cloudy white soup. Every restaurant has developed original recipe of noodles and soup, and offers noodle top-up service called "kaedama." Tenjin is a town with a unique "noodle culture". Food stalls set up after dark are the night feature of Tenjin. In addition to Ramen and Yakitori, each stall serves original menus. It is a perfect place to enjoy casual drinking and chatting.

\*Food stalls may be closed on bad weather days and during holidays.

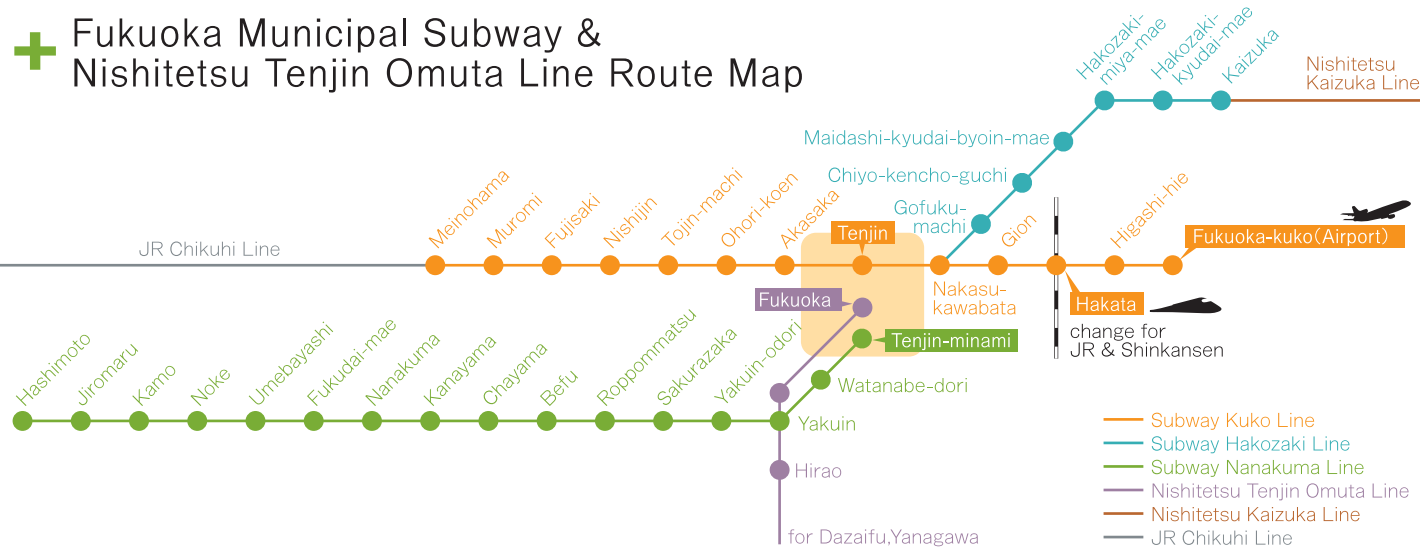

## + Saver Tickets and Cards

### Whole-day Pass

#### Subway Whole-day Pass

This ticket offers one day unlimited ride on any city subway line in Fukuoka. (Discount is offered at the designated facilities in the city by showing your ticket.) Adult 600yen / Child 300yen (Adult 500yen / Child 250yen on Fridays, weekends, and public holidays.)  
\*Tickets are purchased only at ticket machines in the subway stations.

#### Fukuoka City One-Day Pass

The Pass offers unlimited use of Nishitetsu buses for a day within the designated city center zone of Fukuoka. Pair ticket 1,000yen / Family ticket 1,400yen

### Prepaid card

#### Wai-wai Card

The card is valid for all city subway lines and some JR Kyushu trains (on Kagoshima honsen and Chikuhi lines). It offers savings of 20yen for every ride. Three types are available : 3,000yen, 5,000yen and 10,000yen

#### F-Card

The card is valid for all city subway lines in Fukuoka. Four types are available : 1,000yen (1,100yen), 3,000yen (3,400yen), 5,000yen (5,900yen), 10,000yen (11,800yen)  
\*Shown in the bracket is the actual worth of the card.

## + Easy Commuting with One Coin / 100yen Fare Area

#### Otonari Ticket

The fare between two successive stations on all subway lines is 100yen for adult (50yen for child). You can either purchase Otonari ticket at ticket machines or use prepaid cards and pass through the automatic ticket gate.

#### 100yen Loop Bus

For one ride on any buses operating within the area between Tenjin and Hakata Station, the fare is 100yen for adult (50yen for child). For further information, visit our website or check the information map at the bus stops. You can pay the fare in a regular way (by cash, bus cards etc).

#### 100yen Loop Bus from / to the Station

The fare is 100yen for adult (50yen for child) between any two bus stops located within 1 km from Nishitetsu Fukuoka (Tenjin) Station. The same rule is applied in the area around Yakuin Station and Hakata Station.

## + Fukuoka City Loop Bus ‘Green’

‘Green’ is a sightseeing loop bus that connects major tourist spots in the downtown of Fukuoka with one loop taking about 80 minutes. You can board and alight from a bus at any bus stop you like. It is perfect when you want to visit the tourist spots as you please. The Green Pass offers one-day unlimited rides on the Green bus and other local buses for 700yen within the designated urban center zone. The Green Pass can be purchased at Hakata station bus terminal, information centers, major hotels and on the buses.

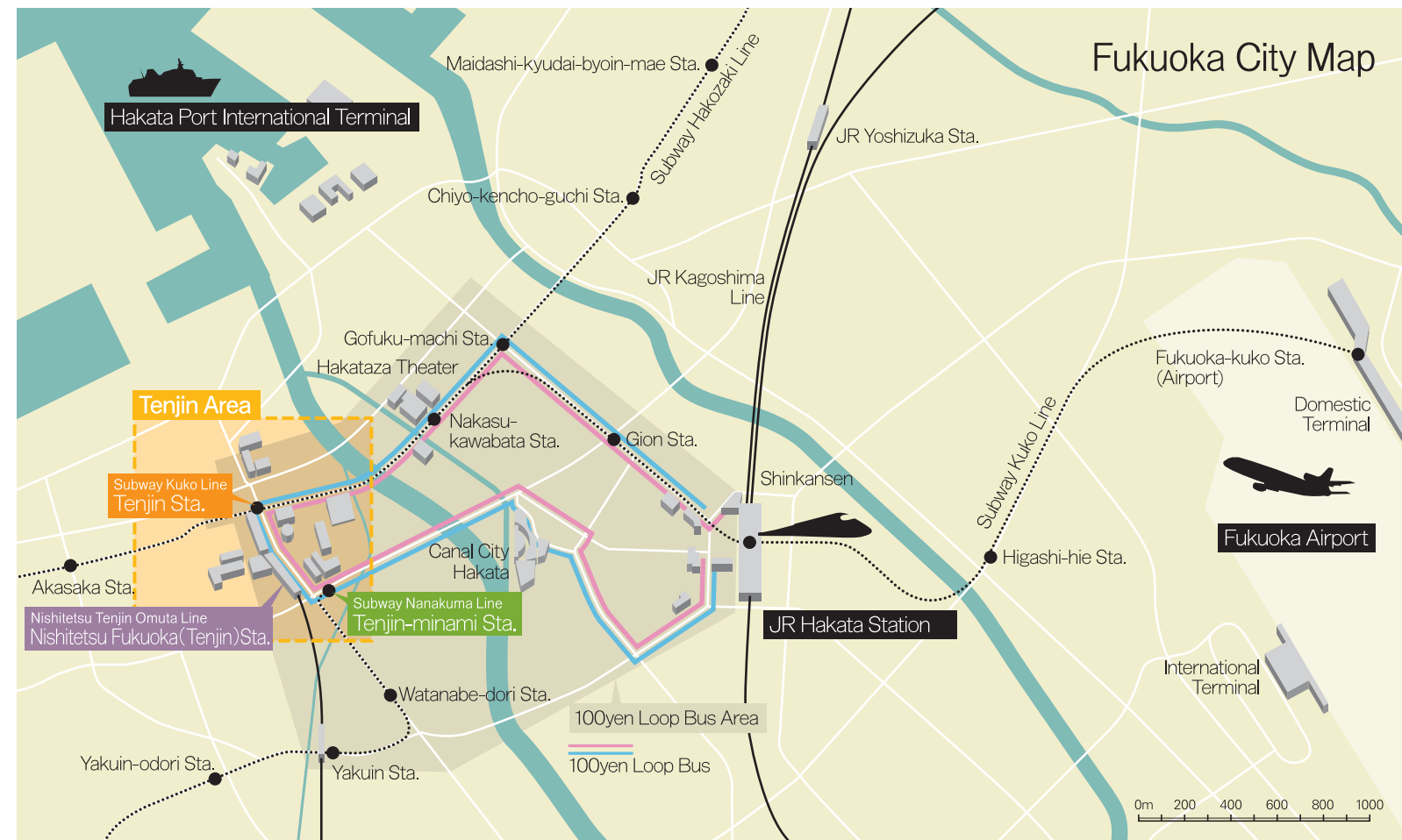
### How to Ride and Pay on the Buses

How to Ride and Pay on the Buses. Board a bus from the central door and alight from the front door. If you wish to pay by cash, take a numbered ticket from the dispenser near the door when get on the bus. And drop the numbered ticket and the fare shown on the front monitor in the fare box when get off the bus.

Tenjin is conveniently located near Fukuoka Airport, Hakata Port, and Hakata Station. It has a good traffic network of subways, trains, local buses in Fukuoka City and long-distance buses connecting between main cities in Kyushu. The bus and subway fare starts at 100yen. Various kinds of saver tickets are also available.
